Pastor's Message-

PENTECOST SUNDAY READING!

Can you read Spanish? French? German? Norwegian? Latin? Greek? Gaelic?

The story of the first Pentecost (Acts 2) tells of crowds of people throughout the Middle East converging on Jerusalem for the Jewish holiday of Pentecost (also known as the Feast of Booths). The Holy Spirit descended upon the disciples and enabled them to speak in languages of the people from other countries, so that the Good News of Jesus Christ could be proclaimed and heard by all who were there. Luke (who wrote the book of Acts), describes what must have been a chaotic scene – so much so that some of the visitors thought that the disciples were drunk! (Acts 2:13)

Help us re-create the first Pentecost morning!

If you are able to read a language other than English outloud (your pronunciation doesn't have to be perfect) and will be present in church on Sunday, June 4, you could be a part of the cacophony of languages as we read together Acts 2:1-7, 12-15, 22b-24. If you don't have a Bible in the language of your choice, check in with Pastor Daphne, who can get you a copy of the passage.

Since the passage will be read (in English) at the microphone by the Reader, congregation members will hear the story in a language they understand, while surrounded by the sounds of languages they may not understand.

when we are born?), or that baptism is the only gateway to salvation (wouldn't a loving God still want to save those who were never baptized?), nonetheless, being baptized is one of the most important moments in our lives as Christians.

- ♦ We are (symbolically) washed in water in the name of the Trinity: Father, Son and Holy Spirit. From that moment on, we begin a lifelong dance with each manifestation of God creator, redeemer, and sanctifier. Some of us relate to one person of the Trinity more closely than the other two, but we claim and are claimed by this God who yearns to relate to, walk with, and guide us.
- ♠ We are anointed with holy oil (in our case, it has been blessed by a bishop), and "sealed by the Holy Spirit and marked with the cross of Christ forever." Forever. Nothing we can do or say can break the bond God has made with us because it is God doing the promising, and God is better at keeping promises than any of us, to be sure! One of my teachers used to say that in baptism, God grabs us by the neck and never lets us go no matter how hard we try to get away. From the moment we are soaked and blessed, whether we walk, run, skip, hop or dance away or toward God, we are still bound for life in God's presence.
- ▲ We are welcomed as members of the church, the Body of Christ. Within this community of saints and sinners, we are invited to grow, learn, make mistakes, forgive and be forgiven, and discern what gifts God has given us which we can share with the world (and, if we are lucky, make a living while we are at it).

I celebrate my birthday one day a year – but I can celebrate my baptism every day of the year! So can we all, and so does God. Our birth-days into the church are a holy-day like no other. Martin Luther advises: "when you wash your face, remember your baptism," and of course, even if

we forget, God never does.

May this coming month be filled with happy birth-days for us all!

Our total Operating giving for March 2017 was \$5,715 and our expenses were \$9,566 giving us a deficit for the month of \$3,851 compared to a loss last year of \$856. As the above shows our giving this year is ahead of last year by \$5,891, thanks to some extra gifts, but behind our budget by \$811. Our expenses thru March are over budget by \$3,993 and over last year by \$4,421 primarily because of seasonal expenses like plowing (\$4,392 this year compared to \$2,400 last year) and heating bills (\$2,034 this year and \$1,466 last year.) April should be about even as we have 5 Sundays in the month, including Easter Week and we should be finished with snow plowing and large heating bills. We still have to watch our other discretionary expenses. *John E. Downs, Treasurer*


Council Notes

Council met 4/26. Each month, we will be reviewing a portion of the proposed constitution. (There is a link on our website to view the document.) Pastor is very appreciative of all the work many put in for Holy Week services, flowers, Easter breakfast and the Easter Egg Hunt. Confirmation classes are going well and pastor is pleased with student's participation. The financial reports showed a deficit (as detailed on John's report on page 5) - but John did not have to borrow from savings in March. There will not be Sunday School May 14 and May 28. The church lawn is growing strong and property committee needs volunteers to join the mowing team. Jim is going to secure quotes to repair certain sections of the driveway and parking lot. Sue Hartley is going to request help following coffee hour to put together the personal care kits so they are ready for the Ingathering on May 17. The parsonage committee met and are reviewing our insurance and how to manage income vs. expenses. The mini-grant committee will set a date soon and the Reconciling in Christ committee will be meeting 4/30 following worship.

We will explore the many dimensions of this powerful story from Luke's gospel as we focus on the theme "Get Off Your Donkey...Be a Leader!"
